The Westminster Choir and Monticello String Trio offer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's *Missa Brevis in D Major, K. 194*. This setting of the Mass was completed in 1774—by the 18-year old Mozart—for ordinary use in the Salzburg Cathedral. A “Mass” is simply a service in which the Sacrament of Communion takes place. Music for the “ordinary” parts of the Mass are those which are said (or sung) regularly: Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. In the 3rd century, Augustine of Hippo is credited with saying “those who sing pray twice.” Today’s music is an offering in the same way that the architecture and stained glass of the church are offered. It is finely wrought music that the musician offers to God on behalf of the people of God. May the prayer and praise of the choir and instrumentalists become your own as we worship God in the beauty of holiness.

Today we will receive communion by intinction. The transept pews will be served first, followed by the main sanctuary and balcony. Proceed down the center aisle and go to the most available servers and take a piece of bread, dip it in the cup and eat. Please return to your pew using the side aisle. **Gluten-free communion wafers** are available.

Ordinary Time, a season focused on Jesus’ three-year public ministry, teachings, and miracles, is a reminder that the mission of the church is to share the hope of Christ with the world.
