The Westminster Choir and Monticello Chamber Orchestra offer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's *Coronation Mass*. A "Mass" is simply a service in which the Sacrament of Communion takes place. Music for the "ordinary" parts of the Mass are those which are said (or sung) regularly: Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. In the 3rd century, Augustine of Hippo is credited with saying "those who sing pray twice." Today's music is an offering to God on behalf of the people of God. May the prayer and praise of the choir and instrumentalists become your own as we worship God in the beauty of holiness.

Today we will receive communion by intinction. The transept pews will be served first, followed by the main sanctuary and balcony. Proceed down the center aisle and go to the most available servers and take a piece of bread, dip it in the cup and eat. Please return to your pew using the side aisle. **Gluten-free communion wafers are available.**

The Congregation is invited to Lemonade on the Lawn in the Blomberg Courtyard after worship, hosted by. The Courtyard is to the left as you exit the front doors of the sanctuary on Cameron Mills Road.

Liturgical Note: The Prayer of Confession and Assurance of Pardon are written by Katherine Lee Baker of the Reformed Church in America.

Today's flowers are given by Neil & Jeanne Sampson in celebration of their 59th wedding anniversary; and by Debra Hinkle in loving memory of her mother, Jeanette A. Hinkle.

The red paraments today mark the Day of Pentecost. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit descending in wind and flame to inspire us to tell the story of Christ's resurrection to the world. *The paraments (the cloths that hang from the pulpit and communion table) are changed with the liturgical calendar, marking the seasons we observe throughout the year.*

Childcare for infants and preschoolers is provided during the service in the preschool wing. **If you need to leave the Sanctuary during worship**, the service can be heard in the Narthex, Library, Library Lobby and Bride's Room off Fellowship Hall.


